Total population change includes a residual. This residual represents the change in population that cannot be attributed to any specific demographic component. See Population Estimates Terms and Definitions at <http://www.census.gov/programs-surveys/popest/about/glossary.html>.

Rates for birth, death, natural increase, net international migration, net domestic international migration, and net migration components are calculated by taking the component value between July 1 and June 30 for an estimate year (e.g., BIRTHS2021), dividing by the average of the July 1 beginning and ending resident total populations for the estimate year (e.g., POPESTIMATE2020 and POPESTIMATE2021), and then multiplying by one thousand.

Net international migration for the United States includes the international migration of both native and foreign-born populations. Specifically, it includes: (a) the net international migration of the foreign born, (b) the net migration between the United States and Puerto Rico (c) the net migration of natives to and from the United States, and (d) the net movement of the Armed Forces population between the United States and overseas.
